The club will offer squares and rounds, as well as some line dancing, hex dancing and a bit of social dance thrown in for fun. Here are some highlights:

Squares: Keep us in mind for daytime A1 dancing - Brampton every Wednesday Afternoon. However, not all of our events are offered on a weekly basis. Jeff is involved in a very successful kids square dance program in schools and to groups such as Brownies & Guides as well as Kids Day Camps. We will also be holding some Cambridge daytime dancing in the near future — watch for the flyers. Keep us in mind if you

know of a group that might benefit from a "one night stand" or "party program" in squares!

Rounds: As well as Etobicoke Rounds that meets 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Fridays in Toronto, ShadowLight Dance Club sponsors many rhythm clinics and specific round dance teaches and workshops. Try our Rumba Clinics for new dancers. With these rhythm clinics, you don't have to know any rounds; in fact, you don't have to know any dancing at all. You will be taught everything you need to know for a great afternoon just moving to the music. There is a new Rumba Clinic slated for April 10 (Sunday afternoon) from 1-3 in Brantford. ### IN MEMORIAM RICHARD E. HINKLE

Richard E. Hinkle, who managed Kmart stores in Niagara Falls and Buffalo and who, with his wife, Mary, led a popular round dance club, died Monday, February 21, 2011, in his Grand Island home. He was 79.

Born and raised in Hazelton, PA, Mr Hinkle began working as a teenager in his hometown at S.S. Kresge Co., parent company of Kmart. A series of promotions took him to Troy; Paterson, N.J.; White Plains; Hartford, CT; Scarsdale; and Syracuse, before he moved to Niagara Falls to open the Kmart store at Military and Packard Roads in Niagara Falls in 1967. He managed that store until 1978, then opened and managed the Kmart store on Hertel Avenue in Buffalo, where he won the company's Retailer Round Table Award in 1981. He retired from the Hertel Avenue store in 1988.

He and his wife became active in the local round dancing community and in 1995 established the Hinkle Round Dance Club, whose dances attracted as many as 75 couples from as far away as Toronto. Their love of dancing took them around the world and they danced on six continents, including the Great Pyramid in Egypt and atop the Great Wall of China.

Mr Hinkle was a member of the Town of Niagara Lions Club, the Town of Niagara Businessmen's Organization and the Niagara Falls and Grand Island Chamber of Commerce. He served in the Navy Reserves for eight years in his 20's.

In addition to his wife, the former Mary DeMarco, Dick is survived by two sons, Richard E. Hinkle Jr. And Mark J. Hinkle, both of Grand Island; a step-son, Robert M. Bennett of Wheatfield; six grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

A memorial service was held at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, February 25 at Amherst Community Church.

We will miss Dick very much. Our deepest sympathy to Mary and her family.
