The Convention starts with Trail-In dances on the evening of July 5th, then closes the evening of July 8th. Dance levels will be from Basic to C3B. There are two full meals included in your registration and many fun tours of the area are offered. Fantastic callers from all over North America will keep you entertained and having a great time. If you are a first time dancer to this Convention, you can apply for a discount. Go to the website for all the information. Also, starting on July 2nd, you are invited to attend the Caller School which is a fantastic opportunity for only US\$75.

After a three year absence, <u>Spring Spree</u> will be back in Peterborough on Saturday, April 22. Mainstream, Plus and Advanced levels will be offered in three halls, with three great callers: Jeff Priest, Brian Crawford and Don Moger. Register early to save!

As an opportunity for clubs to stimulate interest in learning to be a caller, the T&D committee voted to pay up to \$100 if a club wishes to invite a qualified caller to give a short presentation to your club members. Callers who do caller training are Barry Clasper, Jeff Priest and Don Moger. It is hoped that clubs will take advantage of this offer before the July caller school in Ottawa There might be people in your club who have never thought about learning to call, but hearing more about it, maybe they will give it some thought.

DESERVING RECOGNITION

It is said that if a person or persons deserve something, it means that they should be recognized because of their actions or qualities.

Recognition is the act of recognizing someone or identifying something when you see it.

The Ontario Square and Round Dance Federation wants to give deserving recognition to those that have made outstanding contributions and gave freely of their time, energies, and talents in pursuit of keeping modern square and round dancing alive and well in Ontario.

As most are aware, The Ontario Square and Round Dance Federation encompasses clubs from the following regional associations:

- 1) Lakehead and District Square and Round Dance Association (LDSRDA)
- 2) Eastern Ontario Square and Round Dance Association (EOSARDA)
- 3) Toronto and District Square and Round Dance Association (T&DSRDA)
- 4) Southwestern Ontario Square and Round Dance Association (SWOSDA).

Through the Ontario Federation, those deserving of recognition within the square and round dance community, specifically those in Ontario, are presented with either an Ontario Trillium Award of Merit or an Ontario Trillium Award for Long Service.

Clubs within the regional associations as listed above may submit two applications of each type per year for approval. Approved applications are then forwarded to the Ontario Square and Round Federation board, no later than **April 30** of each year, for final critique, acceptance and presentations.

The process is simple. If you know of a person or couple that are deserving of special recognition associated with square or round dancing in Ontario,

the Ontario Square & Round Dance Federation
website provides simple and easy directions on filling
out a nomination form.

After entering the website, scroll down the page to "Trillium Awards" and then further scroll down to "Find Out More".

Select the award you believe the person(s) you are nominating are most deserving, then click on "Nomination Form" for that particular award. You can download the form or view the form, whichever you prefer. Be sure to follow the nomination guidelines as listed below the nomination forms on the website.

After filling out the form, forward to your regional association for approval after which they will forward to an Ontario Federation representative. Remember that nominations must be received by the Ontario Federation by **April 30** of any given year.

"Everyone wants to be appreciated, so if you appreciate someone, don't keep it a secret."

Take the time and make the effort to nominate a deserving person or couple that you believe should be recognized for what they have done for square and/or round dancing. Let them know that they are appreciated and that we recognize the contributions they have made.

TRIANGLE SQUARES - Toronto

Last year, Triangle Squares started dancing at the end of February after almost two years of being in lockdown. It was challenging finding a venue that was open to dance groups, but we have managed to dance continuously, except for a summer

break, in two school gyms, three churches, and two condo building party rooms. We have over 50 dancers registered in four classes: SSD (Social Square Dancing), Plus, A1, and C1.

A big challenge was keeping everyone free of COVID. We are grateful to all our dancers who cooperated by wearing masks and being vaccinated, which has prevented COVID from spreading through our classes and dances.

In 2022, we hosted three successful dance events:

Checkmate, our year-end dance weekend in July, was well attended by 67 dancers from across Ontario, Manitoba, Quebec, and the US. The main callers were Dave Hutchinson and Barry Clasper, with Wendy VanderMeulen and Osamu Miyabe calling the Trail-In dance..

Dave Hutchinson returned to Toronto for our **Halloween** dance, which attracted creative costumes.

We ended the year with a fabulous **Holiday Dance and Potluck Dinner** in December. Tim Crawford kept us moving and entertained.











Waterdown Village Squares reopened September 2022 in our pre-Covid location at St James United Church in Waterdown, Ontario. We have weekly dances; Tuesday evening features a review of Plus and Thursday evening features Basic and Mainstream and welcomes new dancers. We are fortunate that Jim Lee and Bill Everett have returned as our callers.

Waterdown Village Squares maintains both a website and a Facebook page to publicize our club events and to recruit new dancers

In October, both dance nights had Halloween Dances with dancers wearing orange and black, or Halloween costumes. Prizes were awarded for the best costume.



We celebrated our return to dancing with our Christmas Hoedown. The evening started with a sing-along carol session led by our own Bill Everett on the electric keyboard. A Christmas themed dance followed with both of our callers covering all the levels we dance. Our club dancers wore red and green holiday outfits. It was wonderful to see the hall filled with happy dancers like the old days! We are returning to weekly dances on Tuesday January 10 for learning Plus and Thursday January 12 for Basic and Mainstream. For both nights square dancing starts at 7:30 pm.

We are a Basic/Mainstream club in Peterborough. Our caller, Wayne Whatman is popular with all our club members and he shows a lot of patience teaching new dancers. Five new dancers

In November, we held a Mainstream workshop led by Dave Hutchinson and we will be doing another one in February. We have had difficulty convincing our pre-Covid dancers to return. We are optimistic that the club will grow and prosper this coming year.
