Covid-19 has certainly redefined our lives, not for the better. Yes we have had time to read, sew, garden, creative cooking or other at home activities. But for most of us social isolation is not a way to live.

Both the Ontario Square and Round Dance Federation and our Association cannot recommend that clubs start up now. We must abide by the health authorities and their recommended guidelines.
