A **Basic Workshop** has been organized for Tuesday, March 20<sup>th</sup> to aid our first year dancers in their preparations for Spring Spree.

We'll be having a Crazy Hat Dance Monday, April  $2^{nd}$ , where all proceeds plus half the Share The Wealth will go to a local charity. We're anxious to see all the unique creations as our members take this opportunity to earn a dangle for their efforts.

Speaking of dangles, some of our members earned their Road Runner dangle, and others are working towards it by attending one special square dance function in Peterborough and two special functions given by Clubs outside of Peterborough.

We welcomed fourteen new dancers into the Club in February after they completed their four-week session of lessons at a separate venue. Choosing to hold these lessons outside of our regular Club night proved to be successful and we plan to do so again in September.

# Another Dancer Goes Down For The Count!



o, this is not the World Boxing Association or World Wrestling Association Report, this is about our beloved Square DANCING activity! An activity that is supposed to be fun, relaxing & enjoyable and yet.... we still have an ability to HURT each other!

I'm writing this because I'm annoyed, as I just learned of another dancer who has been permanently injured while dancing. YES, while dancing! Permanently meaning he'll never square dance again AND thus he & his wife are no longer able to do what they love doing most! Square Dancing has been their life for many years, and now it's done, all due to a physical injury caused by another dancer(s). Yes, the bracketed (s) is correct, more than one dancer contributed to the end result.

What kind of injury am I talking about? A wrenched shoulder with the resulting rotator cuff injury that cannot be repaired, thus a permanent situation. All caused by another dancer 'hanging on' & trying to force 'their will' on another without thinking!

Unfortunately, this is not the first time that

I've seen this happen and one of the prime reasons why I, as a Caller, continually (ad nausea sometimes) "preach" about the importance of hand contact. No, it's not hand "holds", it's hand CONTACT! A firm but gentle use of hands to just say "I'm here" - nothing more than that. Especially important in Ocean Waves, when the hands are "up" - it's 'contact' with crossed palms only, NO fingers interlocking; NO thumbs entwined; NO GRIP of any kind whatsoever - EVER! And so if there's a 'disagreement' about who goes which way, you 'part company' easily as the hand contact slips apart. However, if you're 'hanging on' (thumbs, fingers, whatever), that's when injuries happen, as shoulders are wrenched, fingers twisted, wrists strained. That's bad enough when we were younger, but as we age, the end result can be very painful & often debilitating - such as in this recent case.

I can think of a myriad of 'reasons' this is going on and I'm sure that's it's not a deliberate action by anyone, BUT despite my many years of 'preaching', it continues to happen.
